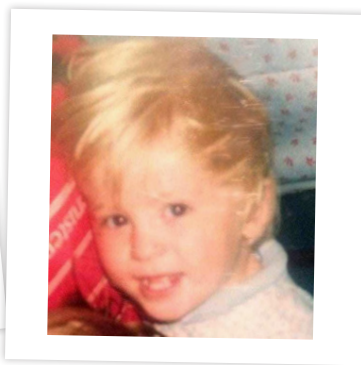

He'd been a captain in the first western forces to liberate a concentration camp and had been present at the Nazi surrender and ceasefire. But now he lived in this large crumbling building on the outskirts of a rural town, filled with bats and broken staircases and gaps in the ceiling, though he did have a normal house he would return to when the weather was bad, he much preferred pottering about this old place. Some of the rooms were cleaned up and nice while others had fallen into disrepair. There was one particularly memorable one: a large dining room filled with almost every copy of the Irish Times since the 1920's, piling high on the tables, from the floor to the ceiling, so many newspapers that the wooden floor was visibly bending and collapsing with the weight, and we'd ask him why he had this, "Ohh," he'd say, "In case I ever get around to writing my memoirs and I needed to look something up."

I was six or so at the time and it was the first time he'd met me, and after waxing lyrical to my family about many of the old stories about the place, he asked me if I had a watch. I said that I did, a little blue plastic thing. "Very good, you will find this useful later!" We were to be staying in some of the cleaned out bedrooms upstairs and he explained to me that there was a ghost called the Old Minister who might come out during the night. If he saw me he would ask the time, so I had better make sure I could see my watch in the dark and give him the precise time or he would be most upset. No more was said of it and my grand uncle continued to rant on about the renovations to the building that he was always planning but never did.

Unsurprisingly, I wasn't sleeping great that night. My sister and I were sharing this old starchy bed and I could only just barely see the dials of my watch thanks to the moonlight through the tall windows, rustling tree branches and white lace curtains. I thought I heard creaking downstairs and I was growing restless. I decided there was likely no ghost, so if I checked there wouldn't be one there so I could head back to sleep, and in the unlikely event there was one, I'd just tell it the time so I could sleep in peace.

I crept downstairs and there was a warm light coming from the drawing room. Inside was a large fireplace with one of those electric fire heaters, the fake embers flickering red, and my Dad was sitting in there smoking a cigarette in his slacks and shortsleeves. I recall his glance of mild surprise at seeing me walk in. He asked me if I was having trouble sleeping, to which I said yes, not wanting to mention the ghost, and he picked me up and sat me on the couch. He said "Yes at your age I always had trouble sleeping here. As a matter of fact I still do." When I eventually mentioned the ghost, he smiled and said, "Oh I wouldn't worry about that. He's been telling that story a long time. Some people never grow up." Dad found a deck of cards and started playing cards with me on the cushion in the middle of the couch. As time passed round by round, game by game, later into the night my eyes grew heavy and I fell asleep and he picked me up and he took me to bed. It's a happy memory I go back to quite a bit.
